Considering Architectural or Landscaping Additions or Modifications???

Although we experienced a rather mild winter our homes still — in some cases — fell victim to the ravages of old man winter. One assumes that many such issues can be handled with

the application of some simple main-



tenance procedures. However, if one intends to make changes to the exterior structure or landscaping of their OV property, please be reminded that prior ap-

proval from the Board is required. In certain cases one may be required to obtain a building permit from the City of Aurora. All necessary documents may be obtained from Alpha



Management or downloaded from the association website (www.OVHA. org). Completed forms shall be submitted directly to Alpha Management (not to individual Board members).

Free Yard Waste Collection

AURORA – Spring yard waste collection in Aurora begins on Monday, April 3 and will run for two weeks. The collection of bundled brush begins on the same day and runs through early November.

Yard Waste Collection for Two Weeks

The Spring Yard Waste Collection program runs from Monday, April 3 through Friday, April 14. During these two weeks, residents do not have to use waste stickers to dispose of yard waste.




Yard waste must be placed in a 30-gallon kraft paper bag and not exceed 60 pounds. Yard waste mixed with garbage or yard waste in a garbage can or plastic bag will not be collected.

Beginning Monday, April 17, a waste sticker, which is the same one used for excess garbage, must be attached to the bag.

Bundled Brush Collection through Early November

The Bundled Brush Collection program also begins on Monday, April 3 and runs through Friday, November 3. No waste stickers are required for this collection.

Branches and limbs that are ½ inch to 4 inches in diameter and 2 to 4 feet in length must be bundled and tied. The bundled brush should be placed at the curb in neat, manageable piles with the cut side of the limbs facing the street. Branches and limbs that are less than ½ inch in diameter are considered yard waste.



Collection on Regular Garbage Day

Both yard waste and bundled brush collection will take place on the regular garbage collection day and should be placed at the curb by 6 a.m. that morning.

they shall incur at the closing includes a disclosure statement as well as the final inspection letter provided by Alpha Management.

Did You Really Want to Know???

- Garbage, combustible refuse, recyclables or trash or rubbish containers to be emptied or removed by licensed scavengers for the city within residential areas of the city shall be placed and grouped at the street curb only after 7:00 p.m. on the day prior to the day assigned for pickup, and all empty containers must be removed by 7:00 p.m. on the day of the pickup. (City Ord 20-4)
- Dead animals are not considered as garbage and should not be placed in garbage cans. (City Ord 20-5e)
- It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to collect, obtain, possess or pick up any recyclable item deposited for collection in a city-owned recycling bin which is placed in front of a residence as part of the city's recycling program, unless such person, firm or corporation is providing a service as part of a municipally contracted recycling service. (City Ord 20-15)
- The annual salary of the mayor shall be as follows: May 1,2017, through April 30, 2018, one hundred forty-seven thousand and sixty-one dollars (\$147,061.00). (City Ord 2-28b)
- The annual salary of an alderman from May 1, 2017, through April 30, 2018, nineteen thousand seven hundred and eleven dollars (\$19,711.00), plus expenses. (In addition to \$75 per committee meeting and City Council meeting) (City Ord 2-59)
